Notes:

- Students are charged only about 50% of the actual cost to African Bible University of the student's tuition, accommodation and food. Since every student is already being subsidized to a great degree by the university we strongly recommend that students are diligent about raising their own fees from churches including their home church, individuals and donor agencies, not forgetting of course to petition their Heavenly Father for their every need.
- Semester fees are due **IN FULL** at the beginning of each semester. Students are required to pay by bank slip directly to Barclays Bank and present their receipt on Registration Day. In exceptional circumstances application may be made to the Business Manager for an installment payment plan, in which case all fees must be cleared a month before final exams.
- It is the policy of the University not to offer scholarships to first year students. Thereafter students may apply for a partial work scholarship. The maximum work scholarship covers only half each semester's fees, excluding books. Therefore even in second through fourth year students will need to bring in additional funds.
- Students with sponsors in the USA may send their fees through our USA office. Mail a cheque made payable to African Bible Colleges, Inc, to P.O. Box 103, Clinton, MS 39060, USA. Write on the memo line the name of the student, and 'Uganda campus'. Please note that the USA office will deduct 7% to cover administrative costs.
- Please note that ABU does not handle personal funds. There are several banks very close to the campus where students may open an account, or alternatively personal funds may be sent through Western Union.
